





The Joshua M. Freeman Foundation, a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, was established in 2007 to honor Josh Freeman, the former Chair of the Carl M. Freeman Companies, after his untimely death in December of 2006. The Foundation seeks to honor Josh's passion and commitment to excellence by creating programs he would have been proud of. These programs include Freeman Arts Pavilion, an outdoor performance venue near Fenwick Island, which presents over 60 performances a year, and our Arts Access Initiative, which provides K-12 students and underserved families of Delmarva year-round access to high-quality, diverse arts experiences at no cost. Annually, more than 80,000 residents and visitors are impacted through our mission of advancing arts access for all through performance, education and advocacy.

## FROM OUR President

Each year as we prepare this annual report, we take time to reflect on the impact of the foundation's mission in the last 12 months. Since our founding in 2007, we have proudly highlighted the growth of our programs in these pages, noting year after year, the steady increase in visitors to The Freeman Stage, students reached through our Arts in Education program, and members of the community able to partake in free arts experiences.

In the face of a global pandemic, those metrics by which we have showcased our past success are smaller this year. But they are in no way any less impressive than our accomplishments in prior years. In fact, I would suggest that 2020 brought to the forefront a story beyond the numbers. We had the opportunity to witness the resolve, grit and resourcefulness of the entire Joshua M. Freeman Foundation team, from our Board of Directors and staff, to our volunteer corps and dedicated sponsors.

COVID-19 has had a devastating impact on lives and livelihoods throughout our country and the world. The performing arts industry all but shut down, with only a handful of organizations across the country able to host live events. When we could no longer have in-school Arts in Education programming, we knew it was our mission to reach children and continue arts enrichment activities virtually. We pivoted and found a way.

This annual report celebrates the amazing work of the foundation in 2020 to fulfill our mission and purpose. My heartfelt gratitude goes out to everyone who contributed to this success: patrons, sponsors, volunteers, staff members and business partners. As we continue our efforts in 2021, we are committed to remain future focused and mission strong. The best is yet to come.



# OUR SPECIAL SEASON OF THE ARTS

In order to safely host live performances during the global pandemic, the organization had to quickly put into place stringent public safety measures to protect patrons, performers, staff and volunteers. Central to that strategy was the innovative concept of "seating pods," circular areas that were spaced six feet from each other, and could accommodate up to four individuals (family pods seating up to four adults and two children were made available as well).

Once the Board of Directors voted to move forward with a season, the operations team worked tirelessly over a five-week period to prepare the venue, and train the staff and volunteer corps for new safety protocols. Hand sanitizers, a cashless policy for food/beverages, grab & go snacks, floor decals, and hand washing stations were all put in place. Videos, social media posts and venue posters were created to educate patrons about the safety measures in place.

And then the question became, how will the public respond?

All doubts were erased on opening weekend, July 9-12, as grateful fans filled the lawn and enjoyed a few hours of music and fun under the stars. Every two weeks a new line-up of acts was announced, featuring local fan favorites, like Lower Case Blues, Kategory 5 and Tranzfusion, to beloved tribute bands, including Kashmir: The Live Led Zeppelin Show, Technicolor Motor Home: A Steely Dan Tribute and Sweet Baby James (James Taylor tribute). Word of mouth continued to spread, and the venue began to fill to its conservative capacity of 388 patrons.

By the time the season wrapped on Sept. 12, with a double-header performance by Fleetwood Mac tribute band, Tusk, we tallied 49 total performances (with 32 sold out shows), hosted more than 11,000 patrons, and provided 213 artists the chance to practice their craft in front of a live audience, for many the first time since the March shutdown.

## Arts Access Program WHEN SCHOOLS WENT VIRTUAL. WE FOLLOWED

When our government and public health agencies mandated remote learning for our local schools, it meant all in-person Arts in Education programs were canceled. To continue providing arts enrichment activities — so vital to the students' academic, emotional and cognitive development — we created several virtual programs to support teachers and families.

- Weekly Dose of the Arts: A curated collection of grade-appropriate arts activities delivered via email to teachers and broadcasted on our social media channels.
- Whimsical Masterpieces at Home: Local artist John Donato led 10 weekly lessons online, guiding students to create fun works of art, using everyday materials that could be found at home.
- Young Audience Series: Free programming was available each Saturday morning at The Freeman Stage during the summer season, featuring children's theater performances, magic acts, dance and storytelling.
- Fall Arts Explorers Series: The fun continued Wednesday evenings at The Freeman Stage through the end of October for children and their families.
- Creative Nourishment Kits: Art Kits complete with all supplies and step by step instructional worksheets in both English and Spanish - were assembled with the help of our volunteer corps.

## Our Steadfast Supporters THE COMMITMENT OF OUR SPONSORS, DONORS AND VOLUNTEERS MADE IT HAPPEN

Each year, the foundation is dependent on the generosity of our sponsors to help us fulfill our mission. That was even more so the case in 2020, given the catastrophic decline in revenue from ticket and concession sales at the Stage due to the shortened season and smaller audience size. In addition to the dedicated group of 428 season sponsors who supported us, we saw an incredible outpouring of generosity for our other fundraising efforts in 2020, including Giving Tuesday NOW and Giving Tuesday (global days of philanthropy on May 5 and Dec. 1, respectively), 2020 Strong (our end-of-year campaign) and the 14th Annual Joshua M. Freeman Golf Tournament, held at the Bayside Golf Course on Oct. 3. These campaigns broke previous years' records and were instrumental in helping underwrite our ongoing programming. When we couldn't gather together for the Annual Summer White Party, prior attendees were sent a "Summer White Party-at Home Kit," with fun accessories (beads, flashing rings, boas, salt water taffy) that were reminiscent of the event.

With a reduced seating capacity of 388 (versus 2,700 in a normal season), our need for volunteer support was reduced, yet still vital to delivering our mission. A small but mighty team of 97 volunteers brought their smiles (evident even under their masks!), hospitality and welcoming spirit to the Stage for each performance, serving as ticket scanners at the gate and ushers on the green, lending a helpful hand wherever needed. We were particularly proud of long-time volunteer Maureen Griffith who was recognized with a prestigious Governor's Outstanding Volunteer Service Award for 2020 as an Emerging Volunteer Leader.

Whether time, talent or treasure, the unwavering commitment of our sponsors, donors and volunteers is the bedrock that supports the foundation's purpose in creating opportunities to elevate the human spirit.



## IS OUR Present AND OUR Future

On Jan. 1, 2021, the Joshua M. Freeman Foundation unveiled the latest chapter in our evolution by adopting a new brand consistent with our vision and commitment to our future as a premier arts organization on the Delmarva Peninsula. The Freeman Stage is now Freeman Arts Pavilion.

Although the new physical structure of the Freeman Arts Pavilion is still several years away, we have established a multi-phase plan that will allow us to expand our seating capacity in 2021, while still maintaining public safety protocols due to the pandemic. The newly purchased parcel of land adjacent to the prior Stage area will provide ample space for roughly 500 seating pods. Construction of the new pavilion will be done gradually over the

coming four to six years, limiting construction to the off-season (October through May). When complete, the new facility (see illustration

above) will accommodate 4,000 patrons, with 1.100 under roof, and feature state-of-theart sound, lighting and video capabilities, an expanded concession and dining area, and artists' dressing room and production space.

Our vision of becoming a world-class arts organization in this region will reap tremendous benefits for the entire community, and it will continue to serve as an economic driver for the region. Since 2008, we've contributed



more than \$73 million to the local economy for goods and services purchased by our patrons throughout the season. As we begin to rebuild the local economy in the coming months, we are steadfastly committed to do our part in supporting the fiscal health of the community.
